

A statewide literary event, Author Fest is open to anyone interested in any form of writing or reading or the written/spoken word.

“It’s our fifth year, and Author Fest gets bigger and better,” said Laura Ettinger, 2010 Chair of Author Fest. “This conference creates a collaborative forum for any fan of the written or spoken word in all its forms. Keynote speakers for Author Fest are Carleen Brice, whose book *Orange Mint and Honey* was recently made into a Lifetime network movie; Bruce Ducker, who has nine books in publication, including *Dizzying Heights*, and is considered “Colorado’s answer to Carl Hiaason”; Cicily Janus, author of *The New Faces of Jazz*, and; Mark Obmascik, whose humorously autobiographical *Halfway to Heaven* chronicles his mid-life quest to conquer all 54 of Colorado’s Fourteeners.

The two-day literary conference features over 50 Colorado authors who will present sessions on a wide variety of topics, including: self publishing/publishing/publishers, writing, editing, dramatic reading/storytelling, writing exercises, creative nonfiction,

illustrators, graphic novels, how to start a book club or discussion group. Also covered will be kid-friendly topics, such as:

storytelling, creative writing, plotting and use of technology. Other presentations will discuss how to critique books, how readers/writers are using current and new technology (ebooks and readers, vooks, etc.), Internet marketing and using social media for promotion.
